Mexico: Quintessential Quintana Roo

In the aftermath of hurricane Wilma and in just over a year the Yucatan peninsula state of Quintana Roo has not simply been rebuilt, it has been reborn. Bigger, better, even friendlier and more refined.

The area up until modern times was not the playground it is today. This is the place where the Spanish Conquistadors first made landfall in 1517 but was the last area to be conquered. The centuries that followed saw all non-natives being driven out and an independent Mayan nation formed with the area finally being declared a federal territory in 1902 when it was named after Andres Quintana Roo, an early nineteenth century patriot of the Mexican Republic. The government had little control over the area until the 1910's when the army was successful in defeating the Mayan population. It wasn't until 1974 that Quintana Roo became Mexico's youngest state and as a direct result, development of Cancun as a tourist destination began along with similar designs for Cozumel and Isle Mujeres. Resort entrepreneurs were adamant in their reasoning that development could not succeed in a place that was not deemed worthy of statehood.

While super-developed Cancun is Mexico's number one resort destination, 20 miles south and far from the crowds and clamor the nearly 100 mile stretch of Caribbean coastline known as the Mayan Riviera begins. This is an unparalleled paradise of natural wonders, stunning beaches, exotic flora and fauna, coral reefs Jacques Cousteau rated as among the finest in the world, renowned archaeological sights and opportunities to satisfy any client's interest. Her Mayan heritage is strong with thousands of descendents residing in the area many still speaking their indigenous language. Humble and hospitable the simplicity in which they exist today bears testimony to a different time. This is a region at once ancient yet constantly in metamorphosis.]

With so many Mayan temples, the early Spaniards referred to the Yucatan peninsula as 'a very towered land'. Chichen-Itza, already a UNESCO World Heritage Site, heads the list

of Mayan architectural achievements and is so impressive that it is on the short list for recognition as one of the new Seven Wonders of the World. Today the area of Cancun is a towered land for another reason with the area south of it having benefited from the lessons learned of mega development. While an intensely vibrant metropolis of resorts, restaurants, nightlife and shopping possibilities, the major attraction continues to be the beach only this time it is wider as the result of a massive government effort to restore the effects of hurricane damage.

As Cancun accounts for roughly a third of the country's tourism revenue, anything other than swift reaction by both government and private sectors was not an option. Speaking volumes of the character and resolve of the people, in those first days following hurricane Wilma lawyers and doctors worked shoulder to shoulder with hotel workers and shopkeepers to clear streets and restore a working infrastructure.

Agents might want to suggest to clients a stay at Puerto Morelos, a relaxed somewhat unconventional town serving as the entrance to the Riviera Maya. With the electric energy and nightlife of Cancun as well as some of Mexico's most famed archeological wonders close at hand, this tranquil community with its peaceful fishing village heritage is a perfect base for exploring Quintana Roo. Every imaginable form of land and water sport and recreation is readily available including the opportunity to try out the longest zip line circuit in North America. Harnessed to a cable suspended through the jungle treetops, clients take flight in what is guaranteed to be an exhilarating if not heart-pounding experience. Afterwards, a dip in one of the areas dozens of cenotes, pools of crystalline water considered sacred by the ancient Mayas, provides a perfect neutralizer.

A short distance further south is Playa del Carmen or simply Playa as it is affectionately referred to by locals. Also once a fishing village, this hip, epicurean beach town has become enormously popular during the past few years with a cosmopolitan following. A must see is the revived multi-millennium old Mayan ball game which is played nightly at Xcaret Park. Reenacted as faithfully as is known to its traditional form, the game's original purpose was probably more a religious event than it ever was a sport. Today's participants need not be concerned with the ancient reward of winning, that being the honor of sacrifice to the gods. Clients should consider a day trip to Cozumel, the largest and most populated island in the Mexican Caribbean and easily reached by ferry in an hour's time. Despite being the world's largest cruise ship destination in terms of number of passengers, the island is easy to get around. And if snorkeling or scuba diving are a passion, then welcome to the Great Mayan Reef, the world's second largest reef system with clarity of visibility so great that one can see clouds from 20 feet below the surface.

Well worth a visit are Chankanaab National Park, a sea oriented playground renowned for its trees of black coral and underwater statues of Christ and the Virgin and El Caracol, a well preserved example of ancient Mayan engineering ability. Designed to predict weather by creating different sounds formed by the strength and direction of wind funneled through conch shells, at night fires were lit allowing it to also serve as a lighthouse.

Another day trip opportunity is to relatively tiny and far less sophisticated Isle Mujeres or Isle of Women, reached by ferry from either Playa or Cancun. Sun, sand, peace and tranquility are the attractions here. Legend has it that the island was a place for Mayan fertility ceremonies and the ruins of the temple to Ixchel, guardian of childbirth, remain. Clay figures in the form of women were discovered by a sixteenth century slave trader which gave rise to the island's name. Today, it is an almost totally natural, unassuming and refreshingly uncomplicated place where a client can walk the entire town in less than two hours. The preferred mode of getting around the less than five square miles of island is by golf cart and places like El Garrafon National Park are within easy reach. This is a nature area known for its reef and spectacular views of the sea. As in other parks, snorkeling equipment is available and clients have the opportunity to interact with dolphins, simply relax on the beach or at its infinity pool and, if once was not enough, zip line over water. For a different venue, a client may wish to visit Hacienda Mundaca, the home of a pirate who took refuge on Isle Mujeres after a life of slave trafficking and who is best remembered for what was once the magnificent property he created for a local girl for whom he had fallen in love. Unfortunately, the feeling was not mutual and Mundaca is said to have slowly gone mad. Even in paradise, sometimes things don't always work out.

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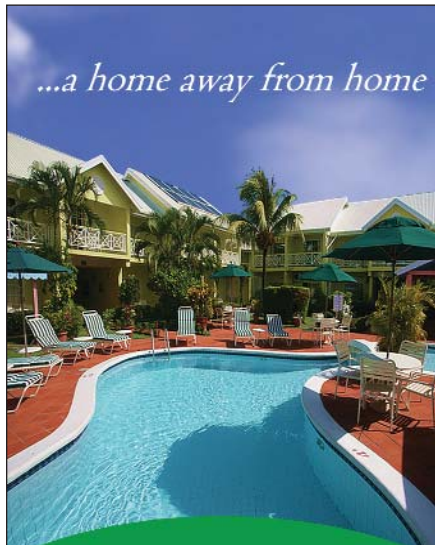

Sea Harvest Restaurant.

The restaurant is characterized by excellent dining with casual attire. The menu is very eclectic and includes such varied dishes as beef samosas, conch chowder, Cuban black bean soup, mussels in Pernod, chicken parmigiana, jerk chicken, chicken tikka masala, shrimp kabobs and steak. It is varied enough to keep anyone happy. Keith's favorite is, "By far, hands down the Indian Lamb Curry!" Adjacent to this is the pool and jacuzzi to take a dip between courses.

Dive Any Time

First off, dive 24/7. Yup, anytime. The reason? Guests are not dependent on taking a boat to a dive site; they can dive from the property. Guests can literally jump in 12 feet of water at the property's edge and do one of the best dives in Grand Cayman. Throw on the equipment, slip into the Caribbean and swim into the clear, warm undersea world for which Grand Cayman is famous — day or night.

Perhaps the consummate pro when it comes to knowing diving in Grand Cayman is Keith Sahn, director of marketing. He is and pretty much perfect for the job.

He first visited Sunset House as a guest in 1981 when, comparatively speaking, diving was still in its infancy. One day he found himself working for them and ultimately got promoted to manager. His acquaintance with the place as a guest, diver and manager gives him a complete package of knowledge, which expresses itself most noticeably in his familiarity with the dive sites.

One of his favorites is Trinity Caves, of which he states, "It is one of the most spectacular wall dives in the Caymans . . . one of the ol' granddaddies and justifiably so. Trinity is a divine congregation of French angels, eagle rays, rain-bowed tropicals and turtles cloistered under coral vaults and candelabras of staghorn coral."

Another high on his list is Orange Canyon. He continues, "It is named for the big orange elephant ear sponges that compete for your attention with the vast webs of deepwater

gorgonians and meaty barrel sponges." Although it is a deeper dive than most and not recommended for beginners, it is also a good site to see pelagics like blacktip and Caribbean reef sharks. The beauty and adventure becomes the inspiration to gain the experience to do the dive.

He adds it is hard to beat a night dive right off the resort that they call Sunset Reef. "There is so much going on in that reef and guests have all the time they want diving, with the complimentary shore diving included. Sunset Reef has its own nine foot tall bronze mermaid out there protecting a thriving, large reef teeming with all different species of fish. Most notable is the grey angels that will follow you around while you are at the mermaid. The wreck of the David Nicholson, a WWII landing craft, sits at the edge of the wall. A spectacular night dive."

A not-to-be-missed dive is the unique Stingray City, perhaps the most famous dive site in the world. It is the only place where divers can see and interact with stingrays every time. They have not failed the divers yet. One can sit on the bottom and they come to you, just like big, playful puppies.

Room Rates

The 60 rooms of the hotel are classified as courtyard, ocean view, suite and apartment. Through March 31, a three night,

two day diving package ranges from \$820.25 for single occupancy in a courtyard room to \$531.50 per person in an apartment that sleeps four.

The seven day package with six days of diving ranges from \$1968.25 for single occupancy in a courtyard room to \$1294.50 per person for an apartment. Wireless Internet is available throughout for a fee. The rooms are air conditioned with digital cable TV (American channels) and have telephones with a data port.

Packages include full, made-to-order, American-style breakfast, daily two-tank boat trips, off-shore diving every day except day of departure and an afternoon review and instructor-guided dive for inactive divers. Also included are tanks, weights, belt and a dive gear locker so guests do not have to clutter their rooms with drying equipment. Additionally, there is a free resort dive course for non-diving partners on a package of more than five nights. And to top it off, free taxi transfers from and to the airport.

Keith Sahn sums up what makes Sunset House special for him when, "From the first time I visited the Briggs family they treated all of us like family and that is what we became. Being a family run hotel, there is a sense of warmth that I have never gotten at any other resort."

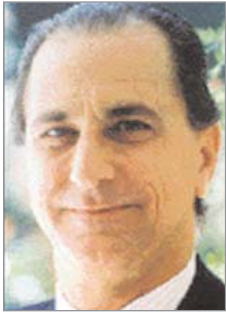

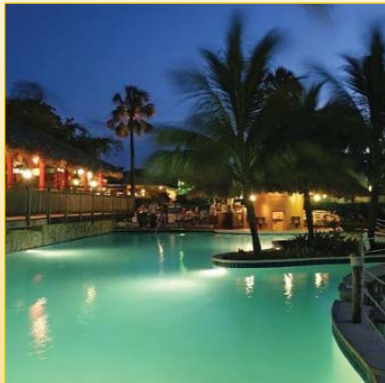

"In our drive to diversify and modernise our economy we've invested heavily in tourism, both by the private and the public sectors. This area will, in the foreseeable

future, be the lead sector in our economy, providing not only jobs, but also impacting on our social and economic life.

"It is therefore important that we have at our disposal, persons who have the vision, the knowledge and the experience to guide us in this important area of the economy. Mr. Chastanet has demonstrated the vision to see the road ahead and to prepare us for the challenges which we will inevitably meet in this fiercely competitive world. St. Lucia may be beautiful, but we must realise that we are not the only pebble on the beach, and to meet the competition we must mobilise the best brains and our resources.

Mr. Chastanet will be backed by a team of men and women who have excellent track records in this field. His own interest in this field is no conflict but an incentive from which the entire industry will benefit. He also has the portfolio of civil aviation so he can bring in the planes to fill the hotels", Sir John said of Chastanet who owns the Coco Kreole and Coco Palm hotels.

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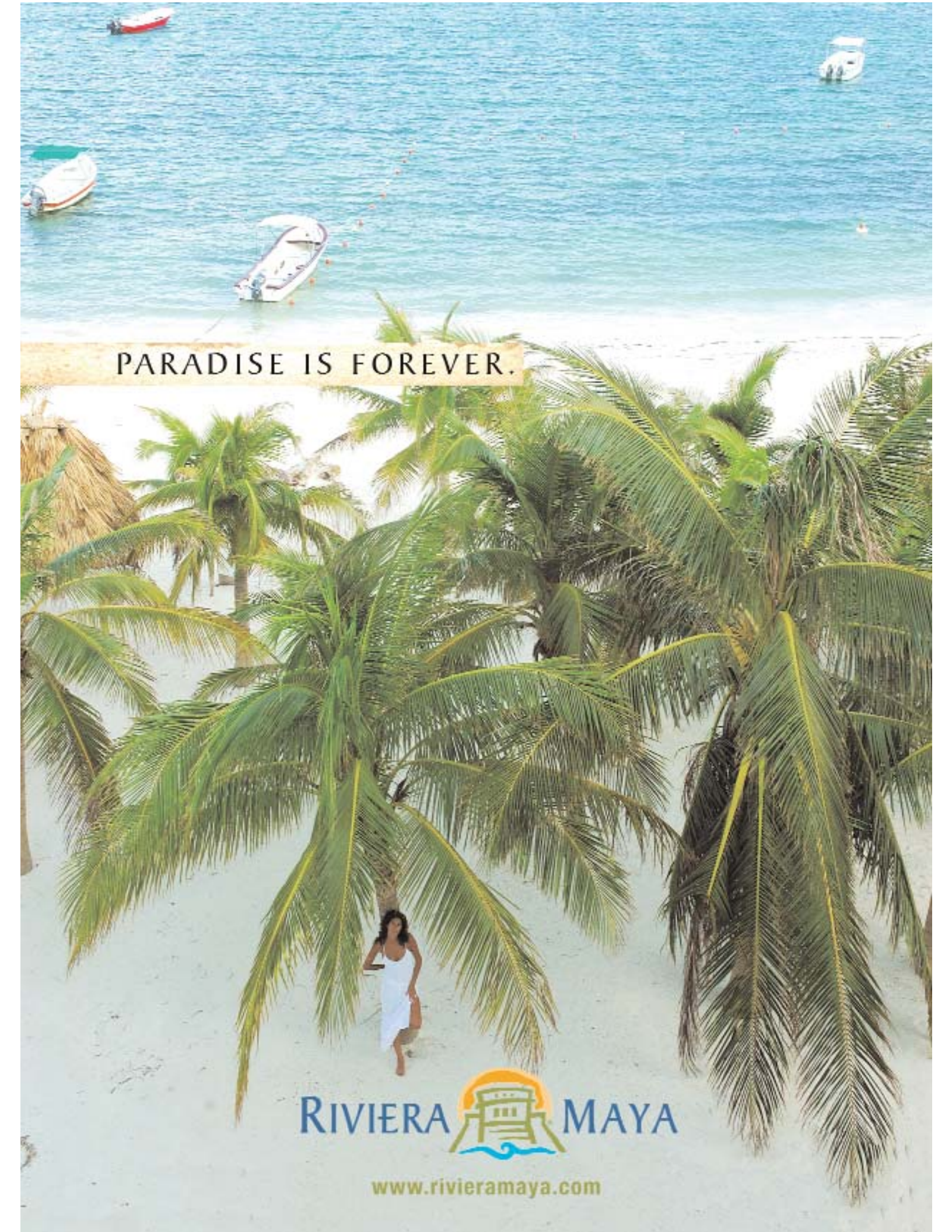
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
